## Background Investigations

By law, City of Turlock and Police Department Policy, anyone working or volunteering within the police department, including employees of other departments who have on-going access to the Public Safety Center and as a result may come in contact with criminal justice information must undergo and pass a comprehensive background investigation before being granted access. Additionally, the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) sets specific background investigation dimensions for police officers and public safety dispatchers. A P.O.S.T. audit of police officer and public safety dispatcher files occurs on an annual to bi-annual basis.

By law, City of Turlock and Fire Department Policy all firefighters, other fire department personal assigned to the Public Safety Facility and fire explorers must undergo and pass a comprehensive background investigation. Starting in May, 2011, the background investigation unit of the Turlock Police Department began doing background investigations for the Turlock Fire Department.

The following is a breakdown of the background investigation activities during the months of July through September, 2016. Because of the ongoing nature of background investigations, a number of background investigations may have been received prior to this quarter but were completed this quarter. These are labeled, carryover investigations. The remainder of the background investigations were, received this quarter. These are labeled, received investigations.

The background investigations unit at the Turlock Police Department consists of four, part-time background investigators, George Gillispie, Richard Duroy, Linda Bradley and Sherry Huskey.


