SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Once again dayshift officers were kept very busy throughout the day. Officers handled a variety of different issues and varying level of severity, and took 16 reports for the investigations. Officers responded to one of the high schools to assist the School Resource Officer in dealing with a combative student. He was going to be disciplined by the school and decided to run. He then refused orders by the SRO and was being obstructive when she was detaining him. He was eventually detained and secured without injury to anyone. Officers responded to 2 calls of deceased residents. Both were by natural causes and no foul play was suspected. Officers also investigated an industrial accident at a local manufacturing establishment. The worker had a pallet fall on her. She was taken to a local hospital for treatment for non-life-threatening injuries.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer made a traffic stop on a vehicle driving at slow speeds, impeding traffic. The driver displayed obvious signs of intoxication and failed the sobriety tests. He was arrested and taken to the hospital for a blood draw prior to being booked into jail. Officers were also dispatched to a security check on a male who was in front of someone's front yard laying on the ground. On arrival officers located an intoxicated male and placed him under arrest for public intoxication. While searching him they found a loaded handgun magazine in his pocket. Officers also found a firearm on the ground nearby that matched the caliber of the magazine that was in the male's pocket. Additionally, the male was also in possession of cocaine. He was taken to jail and booked on several charges.
