SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers stayed very busy during the shift with traffic stops and other types of self-initiated activity. Three arrests were made for DUI. During one of the DUI arrests, a female arrived at the scene to pick up the arrested driver. While checking the license status of the female driver officers determined she had a felony warrant. The designated driver was arrested and booked into jail. Officers also responded to a disturbance involving an intoxicated male. The male was very hostile with officers and refused to go inside his home. Based on his level of intoxication and his demeanor at the time, he was unable to care for himself. He was arrested for public intoxication. After officers arrested the male, he began to kick and pull away from officers. He had to be placed in a WRAP restraint device and was transported to jail.
