COMMUNITY MEETING TO DISCUSS PROPOSED WATER RATE INCREASE

Fall 2017

The City of Turlock relies entirely on groundwater for its drinking water supply. Unfortunately, the drinking water supply is declining, contaminant levels are increasing, and groundwater quality regulations have become more stringent. The reliability and quality of our drinking water supply is vitally important to the health and well-being of Turlock residents; it is also critical to the economic vitality of the business community.

To reduce its reliance on groundwater, the City of Turlock has studied supplementing its groundwater supply with treated surface water from the Tuolumne River. Among its multiple benefits, a surface water supply will

expand Turlock's drinking water supply, improve water quality, enhance water supply reliability, and allow for groundwater recharge.

The City will hold a community meeting for the public to learn more about the proposed water rate increases and the Surface Water Supply Project on Thursday, October 12th at 6:00 pm at City Hall in the Yosemite Conference Room (Council Chambers).

WINTER WATERING SCHEDULE IN EFFECT NOV. 1ST

The City of Turlock's winter watering schedule will go into effect November 1st and will continue until February 28th. The winter watering schedule limits outdoor watering to one day per week. See the image to the left for specified watering days and times. The City of Turlock encourages customers to turn off their sprinklers during the fall and winter months.

Shorter days, cooler temperatures, and plant dormancy are all reasons to stop or significantly reduce landscape watering. As a reminder, there is no watering during or within 48 hours after measurable rainfall.

MANDATORY ORGANICS AND RECYCLING REQUIRED FOR BUSINESSES AND MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENCES

The State of California requires businesses and multifamily residences to arrange for recycling and organics recycling services. Organic material includes: food waste, green waste (landscape and pruning waste), nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper. Multi-family residences are only required to arrange for recycling services for green waste but must also have a co-

mingled recycling program as well. The City of Turlock and Turlock Scavenger Company have services available to assist businesses and multi-family residences to be fully compliant.
