

SPECIAL EFFORTS:

- 1. Coffee with the Chief—On January 13, 2018, Chief Amirfar hosted a Coffee with the Chief event at the police department. This event was open to all citizens and was an open forum to discuss any questions or issues presented to the Chief.
- 2. Traffic Safety Officers worked a community event with Safe Kids Coalition at Walmart by helping install donated car seats correctly for families.

PROACTIVE PATROL EFFORTS:

- 1. Downtown Overtime Extra Patrol Shifts—During the month of January, officers were asked to sign-up to work non-mandatable overtime shifts to provide extra patrols specifically to downtown and parks to address City Ordinance issues, illegal nuisance behaviors, and other criminal violations. A total of 2 extra shifts were worked by officers.
- 2. Daily, the Traffic Safety Unit (TSU) patrols school areas during morning and afternoon traffic for extra traffic enforcement to ensure the safety of students.
- 3. The TSU provided training for every patrol shift about street racing, street racing vehicles, and how to inspect and enforce specific laws that apply.
- 4. The newly assembled Special investigations Unit (SIU) began regular probation searches throughout the city. During the month of January, 21 searches were completed and 15 arrests were made.
- 5. The TSU worked an overtime detail focused on street racing in Turlock on January 20, 2018. As a result, 18 citations were issued to illegal street racers and 5 were sent to the sate referee for inspection. Later that evening, TSU officers combined efforts with CHP in Modesto focusing again on illegal street racers who had planned an event. As a result of police presence, the racers dispersed and left the area.

ANIMAL SERVICES & PET OF THE MONTH:

- 1. Animal Services visited 200 individual residences for proactive license enforcement.
- 2. In an effort to save more of the animals at the shelter, on January 26, 2018, Animal Services sent 13 dogs to a dog rescue in Oregon.


CRIME PREVENTION EFFORTS:


