## SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT EFFORTS:

1. The Youth Academy began during the month of March for 8 participants. Over the course of the academy, topics and hands-on activities that will be covered will range from media and law enforcement perceptions, Neighborhood Watch and a tour of the police department.
2. SIU members began a sex registrant compliance sweep this week that included Homeland Security, US Marshalls, Probation and Parole. As a result, over 100 compliance checks were completed, resulting in 2 arrests and 3 warrant affidavits completed.
