### ANIMAL SERVICES (JULY-AUGUST):

- 1. Jack and Jude Locke raised \$1,124.24 for the Turlock Animal Services.
- 2. Animal Services was awarded a California Pet License Plate spay/neuter grant
- 3. 6 animals adopted during the National Clear the Shelter Event—August 17, 2019
- 4. Animal Services conducted pet license enforcement in various locations throughout the month. 100 residence visits were completed for pet license checks.

#### MONTHLY SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT EFFORTS:

- 1. Special Investigations Unit (S.I.U.) made 19 arrests and recovered three firearms during the month of July and 13 arrests during August. S.I.U. also assisted the F.B.I. with an investigation and service of a search warrant in Modesto.
- 2. S.I.U. conduced a Regional Apprehension Team (R.A.T.) operation during the month of July that included 14 residences being searched and 4 arrests made.
- 3. School is back in session, and the Traffic Safety Unit (T.S.U.) conducted traffic enforcement at schools to ensure the safety of students. The unit is working with T.J.H.S. and the district on ways to improve traffic congestion around the school.
- T.S.U. went to Riverbank for a County Integrated Traffic Enforcement (C.I.T.E.) team operation. The team focused on safety around schools and conducted enforcement.
- 5. T.S.U. received final confirmation that Turlock Police Department has been awarded a grant from the Office of Traffic Safety regarding a Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (S.T.E.P.) This grant funds approximately \$37,000 in overtime enforcement details and about \$3,000 in training for officers.
